[Suicide Postvention: The Critical Role of Educators](#) discusses creating an action plan for the aftermath of a suicide. There are many actions that schools should avoid in the wake of a student suicide. The presenters examine the scope and magnitude of people that are affected by a suicide.

[Supporting LGBT Students in Schools: Suicide Prevention Among LGBT Youth](#) examines how suicide affects the LGBTQ community. LGBTQ students are more likely to have suicidal thoughts and attempts than their heterosexual peers. The school environment can have an enormous impact on a young person's life.

Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for ages 10-24. (2015 CDC WISQARS) Four out of five young people contemplating suicide show clear warning signs prior to the attempt. It is imperative that everyone knows how to recognize signs of concern of at-risk youth and are prepared to react should they see these signs.
